Marcus Bebb-Jones arrives in Garfield County today.

GARFIELD COUNTY, Colorado: Today Marcus Bebb Jones arrived in Garfield County, Colorado and was booked into the Garfield County Sheriff's Detention Facility in Glenwood Springs, with-out incident.

Marcus Bebb-Jones remains in custody at this time at the Garfield County Sheriff's Office, facing a life sentence for the Murder of his wife, Sabrina Bebb-Jones in 1997. Sabrina's skull was discovered in a remote wooded area on Douglass Pass in the North West part of Garfield County.

On Wednesday, November 18, 2009 at approximately 7:00 a.m. London, England time, Marcus Bebb-Jones was taken into custody by members of the Metropolitan Police, Special Crime Directorate, Extradition Unit, New Scotland Yard, London.

Marcus Bebb-Jones was arrested at his home at 41 Merton Close, Kidderminster, Worcestershire, England after an extensive 12-year investigation involving several law enforcement agencies. A Garfield County warrant was issued for Marcus Bebb-Jones in the United States for Murder in the First Degree, Concealing Death and Domestic Violence.

Marcus Bebb-Jones remained in custody since his arrest and entered into the extradition process between the United States (U.S.) and the United Kingdom (U.K.) where efforts were successful to return him to the United States to stand trial.

The 4,776 mile Extradition for the 46 year old began yesterday February 18, 2011 about 10:00 a.m. where Bebb-Jones left on a flight out of London. He arrived in Denver Colorado late last night and was then housed overnight in a temporary holding facility, at the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office Detention Facility, in Colorado.

Bebb-Jones then began the one hundred and fifty (150) mile road trip to Garfield County about 11:00 a.m. Saturday February 19, 2011, arriving at the County Jail about 2:15 p.m. to begin the booking process.

Both Garfield County Sheriff's Office and the 9th Judicial District Attorneys office remain in close contact with the victims' family and will keep them advised throughout this process.

No further information will be released at this time in an effort to protect the prosecutorial integrity of this case.
